9:05 am	<p>Update on Management of Anticoagulants.</p> <p>Over the last several years, five new anticoagulant agents have been approved by the FDA, as well as two new anticoagulant reversal agents. Ophthalmologists should be familiar with these agents, in particular, how to and when to interrupt them for invasive procedures, techniques to manage bleeding in patients using new anticoagulants, and which concomitant medications should be avoided in patients on new anticoagulants.</p>

1:30	<p>Flanged intraocular lens fixation -basic and theory</p> <p>Intrascleral intraocular lens (IOL) fixation technique has some advantages against IOL suturing. Flanged IOL fixation is a simple and minimally invasive method for achieving good IOL fixation with firm haptic fixation. Although the technique is simple, it is not easy. In this talk I will explain the flange IOL fixation and tips for making the surgery a success.</p>
2:15	<p>Advanced Technique for Dislocated Lens</p> <p>There are several countermeasures for dislocating lenses and intraocular lenses. Less invasive lens exchange is important for acquiring good postoperative visual function. As advanced techniques, IOL intraocular reuse, capsule sparing intrascleral IOL fixation, and intraoperative adjustment of refraction will be described.</p>
3:15	<p>Panel Topic: Controversies in Secondary IOLs</p> <p>Many techniques are described and available for secondary IOLs and fixation of them to the or sclera. Some are better than others and there are pros and cons to all. An open discussion these techniques will hopefully guide attendees as they care for and refer patients for these important procedures.</p>
4:15	<p>Panel: Preoperative OCT</p> <p>Each panel member will present a case study for discussion on how to approach retina issues (ERM, VMT, DR) prior to cataract surgery, obtaining anterior segment and retinal input.</p>
